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Our curriculum

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Learning at S.K.H. St. Matthew's Primary School

Hello?

To nurture all students to become Christlike, and guide them to become global citizens, a holistic education with Christian values is provided for all students regardless of their races in our school. To ensure equal opportunities for every student and parent, our school is committed to encouraging and supporting all students and parents, including non-Chinese speakers, through various activities, programmes and services.

1. Learning Chinese Language

We support NCS students to learn Chinese in various ways.

To enhance the effectiveness of learning Chinese Language, in-class support for NCS students is provided in Chinese Language lessons. For example, our Chinese Language Teachers work with a teaching assistant during Primary 1-3 Chinese Language lessons. Pull-out learning and group learning strategies are adopted at our school to foster learning interests and motivation in our students.

Small-class Teaching

To help students focus on learning, get more feedback from teachers and interact with everyone, our class size for NCS students is small.

Learning in Action

Our teachers implements various methods e.g. using visual aids and physcial movements to enhance students' learning performance.





Co-teaching In-class Support

Two teachers teaching together in one classroom allows students to get support and care immediately.

Our teaching and learning materials are school-based and tailor-made.

We provide tailor-made learning and teaching materials for our students to boost their learning performance.

School-based Chinese Language Curriculum

Our teachers design school-based Chinese Language curriculum. Learning materials are tailor-made for students to meet their learning needs. This leads to effective learning.

Adapted Learning and Teaching Materials

We provide adapted learning and teaching materials for our students to improve literacy. Students can scan a QR code to learn how to read and do revisions regularly.

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Use of Smart Pen eLearning is a part of our curriculum. Our students use a smart pen provided by our school to enhance their reading and speaking skills.

Paired-reading Scheme

Senior students are the elder brothers and sisters of our school. They read to the junior students at recess and encourage them to learn Chinese.

Homework Remedial Class

Doing homework can be a challenging task for some children. Therefore, they can attend our homework remedial class after school. During the pandemic, the homework remedial class was conducted via Zoom to help students solve problems when they could not learn at school face to face.







Summer Bridging Course

We are concerned about how our students can spend time wisely during summer break. Therefore, we provide a Chinese Bridging Course to boost their learning performance and prepare them for the new school year.

Learn Chinese across the curriculum.

Our school creates numerous opportunities for students to learn Chinese across the curriculum. For example, by integrating Chinese Language with English Language and other subjects, our teachers coordinate their efforts to conduct several cross-curricular programmes every school year.

Mid-Autumn Festival

Collaborating with the English Department, we celebrate Mid-Autumn Festival with students at school through a series of games, stories and sharing. Not only can we align the learning experience and knowledge with the local culture, but we also make our learning progress enjoyable.















Chinese New Year

We introduce Chinese culture when celebrating Chinese New Year with our students at school. This help students understand the reasons for celebration and enjoy learning in the local context.

Cultural Sharing

To promote the cultural integration of diverse cultures and religions, we invite students with different cultural backgrounds to do a sharing to all students in the school hall. This strengthens the relationship and understanding between students of different nationalities.

2. Cross-curricular Learning

To enrich students' life-long learning through authentic experiences, our school develops cross-curricular programmes to stimulate students to learn new knowledge and life values, as well as apply generic skills, such as collaboration, critical thinking, problem-solving skills and creativity, in real contexts.

STEM Education

STEM week is held annually to celebrate the positive impact on the achievement and development of our students through a series of theme-based events which engage students in experiential learning, problem-solving, critical thinking and collaboration through inquiry, dialogue and creativity.





Our P2 students visit Cube O Discovery Park to discover the mystery of marine life in the underwater world and learn to protect it through multimedia games.



ETECHNOLOGY

We demonstrate how technology impacts our daily life and we encourage our students to think critically. Every coin has two sides, and so does technology. Our students understand that it can improve our lives but also cause other social problems.

P4 students visit H2OPE Centre and learn the importance of saving water daily. They learn the concept of creating a water filter through experiential learning.



After learning the features of insects and animals, our P1 students apply the concept and design a car, leading to an exciting car race in the classroom.



Playing tangram promotes problem-solving and critical thinking skills. It is a painless way for kids to learn about shapes, symmetry, spatial awareness and geometry.

Besides regular Mathematics lessons inside the classroom, our students apply their knowledge to authentic mathematical activities outside the classroom.

We use board games to develop mathematical thinking skills.





Mathematic activities can foster collaborative learning among our students. They inquire about problems, find solutions, apply knowledge and gain new skills together.

Values Education is an essential element in our school curriculum. The following shows some of the events we organise for our students to nurture positive values and growth mindsets.



Sports Day

Sports Day not only emphasises the importance of sports and health, but also develops students' social skills and attitudes of perseverance and integrity.


Produce Green Organic Farm

To share the values of responsibility, commitment and perseverance with our students, we organise a field trip to Produce Green Organic Farm.



Self-reflection

After each cross-curricular event, our students practice self-reflection to evaluate what they have learnt and appreciate what they are thankful for.



Share Love and Joy on English Fun Day

Collaborating with Library Studies and Religious Education, our English teachers invite Dovetales to perform with our students after teaching the Nativity Story and A Christmas Carol. Students can learn these stories in the lessons and understand the true meaning of Christmas. They can also practice a positive attitude by sharing love and care when celebrating Christmas.





After the drama appreciation, our students learn some drama techniques from the actors. They also have a Kahoot! reading competition that deepens the knowledge of the story in an interactive way.

Interview Training Programme

Our teachers become life coaches of Primary 6 students and give them practical advice during the interview training programme. This boosts students' confidence and provides a right direction for them to face new challenges in secondary schools.





Understanding Adolescence Project

This programme is designed for Primary 4 to 6 students to build up their positive values and to help them cope with challenges in the face of adversity. It consists of a series of experiential activities which train students to be team players with self-confidence and self-discipline, while feeling respect, acceptance and care through teacher-student, student-student, and parent-child relationships.



Translating major school circulars and other important matters




Sunshine phone calls

Admissions
